Giving is in the Air


Giving has always been a part of the Mission of St. Luke since its inception in 2011. Through the years we have met people's needs primarily in meeting medical expenses. We all have felt the sting of medical costs. For working families who have no medical insurance it's even worse. When you are sick you cannot work, so not only do you not have your salary while you face medical bills as well. Another crisis that the Latinos face is the loss of employment during the winter months, especially January and February. All the men in our church work in either landscaping or construction. Those jobs stop for nearly two months at the beginning of each year. This is always accompanied by an increase of utilities bills because of the frigid conditions.

We at the Mission of St. Luke are committed to helping Latino families in those emergency situations. Now it's official, we have created a benevolence committee headed by one of our church members. Diana Luna has agreed to lead the committee that will oversee our giving. The seed money of \$1000 was given by a grant from Wells Fargo Bank and the MSL board has designated an additional \$250 a month from the general fund. This means we will give a minimum of \$4000 next year for benevolence.
